Why German?

We live in a globalised world; German is spoken by 95 million people. A second language can open up opportunities for travel, careers and academic life. “The Independent” listed German as the number one language which would lead to the highest paid jobs in the UK and was in the highest demand across job postings.

This course is a radical and exciting departure from the GCSE with more independent study and research and a more rigorous approach to grammar. Reading of German newspapers and visiting German speaking countries are encouraged. There are four main themes:

1. Social Issues and Trends
2. Political and Artistic Culture
3. Grammar
4. Works: Literary texts and films.
