Why Music?

Music is stimulating and enriching and provides an excellent basis for life-long learning. A Level will broaden your musical experience and interests and foster your imagination and creativity.

The course comprises three main musical disciplines;

Performance: extend your performance skills as soloists and/or as part of an ensemble. Teachers and students can choose music in any style. Any instrument(s) and/or voice(s) are acceptable as part of a 10-12 minute assessed performance of a balanced programme of study.

Composing: Compose two pieces per year, one in Western Classical Tradition and in response to a brief by WJEC.

Listening/Appraising: Analysis, listening, history of later Romantic symphonies, later jazz and 21st century music.

Assessment

35% - Performing
25% - Composing
40% - Listening / Appraising
