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
Design and Technology Update

Welcome back to the Parallel Universe

Be challenged, get curious, do maths. Stretch your brain every week.

Dear Parents and Students,

This is a quick note to recommend a website that offers students a chance to complete some extra maths each week, building on the work done in the classroom.

The Parallel Universe www.is completely free and offers a **weekly maths problem sheet**, known as a Parallelogram.

We think this is a great opportunity for keen maths students to stretch themselves and explore mathematical concepts beyond the classroom. This is also ideal for students who want to go on to study science or engineering.

Each Thursday at 3pm students will have access to a new set of online mathematical challenges (a Parallelogram) tailored to their age. There is a separate Parallelogram for Year 7, Year 8, Year 9, Year 10 and Year 11 students. It should take just 15 to 30 minutes to complete each Parallelogram. As soon as students hit the SUBMIT button, their Parallelogram will be marked, so they will be able to see their score and the full solutions. Their work will also be saved and we as teachers at school will be able to see their progress. House points will be awarded regularly to those who complete parallelograms.

The Parallel Universe is the brainchild of Dr Simon Singh MBE, whose book about Fermat's Last Theorem was the first maths book to become a No. 1 bestseller in the UK. He will be delivering many of the maths circles and he has created all of the Parallelograms.
