This is in addition to the KS3 Science Club (open to Y7 and Y8) which will be running on Wednesday Lunchtimes in S7 at 1:45. We had our first session this week and it was wonderful to see so many budding curious minds. We had a look at methane and its flammability.

The practical for you to try out this week, is whether eggs float or not and what does it mean if they do.

The article this week is good news for those who have a fear of needles. Scientists are developing a new gas-based drug-delivery system which could deliver vaccines and other medicines. They would go through the skin, encased in tiny metal capsules that dissolve in the body.


