Year 7 have had a very busy week; first they visited Chepstow Castle as part of their History curriculum and a group of Year 7 students also attended the Diocesan Commissioning Service at Clifton Cathedral. On both occasions we were very proud of our young people who were an absolute credit to the school.

The History department have also been busy, not only with the Chepstow trip but Mrs Sarbatta delivered a poignant Remembrance assembly. We were told about less well-known stories of incredible courage and bravery of soldiers who came from the Caribbean, India and what is known as modern day Guyana. We also found out about local war efforts in Bath to contextualise what was happening in our local area and we prayed again for world peace and unity in our conflicted world.

Today, we remembered all lives affected by war in our annual Remembrance Service. The sun shone down on our uniformed students representing a range of services and the Last Post was played beautifully by **Kezia** in Year 11. Thank you to Mr Robinson for providing us with the opportunity to come together as a prayerful, respectful community to honour those who have been loved and lost in war and conflict, both past and present.

I am delighted to be attending a very special Mass at St Mary's, Julian Road, Bath tonight, with other St Gregory's colleagues, to witness 18 of our students from Years 9-12 make their Confirmation. We are incredibly proud that they are making this commitment to their faith and know that our whole school community will keep them, and their families, in our thoughts and prayers.

It has been a week of highs and lows on the sporting pitches but we are thrilled to announce that our Year 9 Girls' Netball team were placed third in the BANES tournament which is an incredible achievement. Congratulations to our Year 11 Boys' Rugby team who beat Ralph Allen 43 – 0. Well done to all who played and represented the school this week in rugby and netball, especially in some of the weather we've had!

Kintbury Retreats 23/24



We are delighted to share the details of our residential retreat programme for Kintbury this year, which includes opportunities for Year 8, 9 and 10. St Cassian's, Kintbury is a centre owned by the De La Salle community, of which we are an associate member school, and is run by a group of young volunteers dedicated to bringing fun, faith and friendship to fellow young people in a relaxed and engaging way. Retreats are designed to give people an opportunity to take a step back from everyday life, including all its pressures and routines, and instead take part in a fun packed programme of activities, games, prayer and reflection. Kintbury is a huge manor house set in the middle of the beautiful Berkshire countryside, an ideal location for both peace and space, whilst offering outdoor activities such as archery, rope courses, traversing wall and much more.

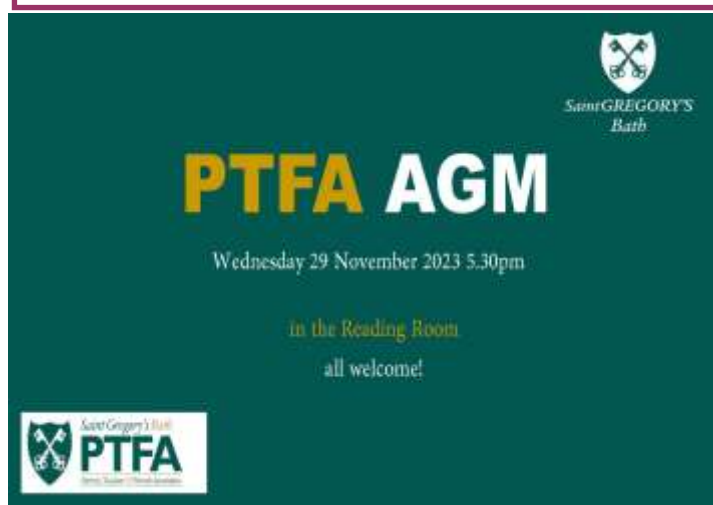
- Year 7 - Who Am I?

Literacy Corners Opening at St Gregory's

Following on from the successful introduction of literacy points into the rewards programme last term, we will now be introducing a scheme of micro libraries, referred to as literacy corners, in each faculty area across the school.



Using these corners we will be able to offer a range of subject specific literature, both fact and fiction. This will give the students the opportunity to support their learning in class as they research further into the topics they study. It will also give them a chance to develop their wider subject interest and knowledge in areas perhaps not covered in the curriculum, all the while developing their literacy skills and their love for reading.



All students are welcome to visit any literacy area, either on their own or in small groups, to browse through subject specific books or magazines and then sit and read them. There is of course an expectation that students use these areas in a calm and respectful manner but we are confident that by offering these spaces, students' love for literacy, as well as their subjects, will grow and develop.

At present the Performing Arts, Humanities, English, Inclusion, Business and RE departments all have a literacy corner and more will appear throughout the rest of the term. I look forward to seeing many of our students enjoying these spaces on a daily basis.



There will be more literacy and Oracy developments at St Gregory's coming soon and we are really excited to see the programme flourishing. Year 7 Trips to Chepstow Castle



On Tuesday 7 and Wednesday 8 November all of our Year 7 cohort visited Chepstow Castle in Wales as part of their ongoing study in History on the Norman invasion and conquest and their work on the first castles in Britain and their defences. Chepstow Castle is one of the oldest stone castles in Britain with its foundations going back to 1067.

This was a superb educational opportunity to see a local castle and be able to tour the castle's surviving defence strategies. Year 7 will also soon have an assessment on The Development of Castles in the Medieval Era, so this was a perfect opportunity to get some first-hand knowledge and to take some pictures to use in their project.



Each tutor group were given a tour designed by our History department and given a work booklet to complete as they explored the castle, explaining why the Normans chose this location, what its strength and weaknesses were and how the castle developed over time.

The highlight from our student voice was the weapons workshop each tutor group was given by our Medieval Weapons expert, Mr Eddiford, which was "epic!"



He demonstrated how medieval sword fights would occur and how to wear chainmail in battle to some of our willing students. He also gave the students an excellent opportunity to have a whole group weapon display after lunch that showed the power of crossbows and the accuracy and fast pace of preparing and firing arrows.



Thank you to our brilliant Year 7 who were wonderfully well-behaved on the trips this week. We look forward to taking more students out on History trips in the very near future, next on the list is Year 9 next month to the Bovington Tank Museum!

Reporting Absences

Feature on the Class Charts (parent) App

There is an option to notify the school if your child is going to be absent. The absence telephone line will still be available, however we would prefer you to use this app if possible. This should not only be easier for you, but will allow the school to be more efficient when recording student absences. Once we have acknowledged the absence, you will receive a confirmation email to the account that is registered in the app.

Absences

If your school has decided to allow parents to report absences, you will see the **Absences** tab when viewing pupils from that school.

Selecting this tab will display a list of **absences that you have reported**, once you have reported them. This includes **when** the absence took place, the **reason** for the absence and who **acknowledged** your absence report.

To report an absence, click on the **Report new absence** button.



Next, enter the details of the reported absence into the **form** provided.

You can also include up to 5 **files** in your absence report as **supporting evidence**. To do this, click on the **Attach supporting evidence** button and select the files of your choice.

Click on the **Submit** button to send your pupil's absence report to their school. The absence can be **edited** and **deleted** until it has been **acknowledged** by a teacher.

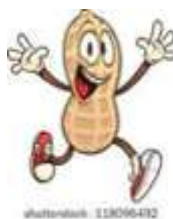


Energy Drinks
