What is the best thing about being young? That was the question Mr Robinson and I posed to all year groups this week in an assembly on Youth Sunday which falls on 26 November, also Christ the King Sunday. The New York Times conducted a recent survey and the top five things teenagers enjoy about being young are:

1. they get to have fun and adventure
2. they have freedom and independence without too much responsibility
3. they don't yet have to face the pressures of adulthood
4. they get to spend time with friends
5. they are learning and growing and there are endless possibilities of who they will become

The last point is the most exciting in my mind: being young is a special time when you are on the brink of adulthood and you can become whatever it is you want to be. At St Gregory's, we really believe our students will discover their vocation and become agents of change through the excellent opportunities we provide both inside and outside the classroom.

Our relentless focus on instilling respect and manners in our students is vital so that they take their place in the world as kind, compassionate, gentle and outward-looking citizens. I reminded all students of the importance of wearing their uniform with pride and having manners, not just inside school but outside school as well - on the buses, in shops, on the streets and whenever they are making their way to and from St Gregory's. I also reminded them to say thank you to the people who care for them each and every day - sometimes this gets overlooked.

Mr Robinson and I also met with the Senate this week (our version of a school council) and our senators were buzzing with energy and ideas to

**World Youth Sunday** - Today we logged on and joined thousands of young people participating in the *World Youth Sunday* activities streamed live online at break and lunch. Youth Sunday on the Feast of Christ the King is an annual celebration of young people and their importance for the present and future. Let us join with the global Church and pray for them all this coming weekend. This reflection is from the opening of World Youth Day in the summer addressed to millions of young people signifying the importance of every one of us being called by name.

You are not here by accident. The Lord has called you, not only in these days, but from the very beginning of your days.

### He called you by name.

Let us listen to the word of God that called us by name. Try to imagine these three words written in large letters. Then consider that they were written within you, on your hearts, as if setting the direction of your lives, the meaning of who you are: you have been

### called by name.

Each of us is called by name. You, you and you, all of us here, myself included: all of us have been called by name. Not impersonally, but by name. Think of this:

### Jesus called me by name.

His words are inscribed in our hearts, and we come to realize that they are written in the hearts of every one of us, as a kind of title that tells people who we are, who you are.

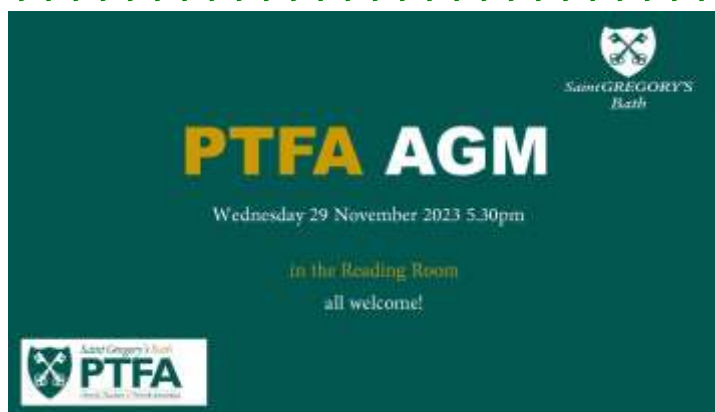

## Reporting Absences

### Feature on the Class Charts (parent) App

Please use the Class Charts app to notify the school if your child is going to be absent. The absence telephone line is still available, however we would prefer you to use this app if possible. This should not only be easier for you, but will allow the school to be more efficient when recording student absences. Once we have acknowledged the absence, you will receive a confirmation email to the account that is registered in the app.

## Absences

If your school has decided to allow parents to report absences, you will see the **Absences** tab when viewing pupils from that school.

Selecting this tab will display a list of **absences that you have reported**, once you have reported them. This includes **when** the absence took place, the **reason** for the absence and who **acknowledged** your absence report.

To report an absence, click on the **Report new absence** button.



Next, enter the details of the reported absence into the **form** provided.

You can also include up to 5 **files** in your absence report as **supporting evidence**. To do this, click on the **Attach supporting evidence** button and select the files of your choice.

Click on the **Submit** button to send your pupil's absence report to their school. The absence can be **edited** and **deleted** until it has been **acknowledged** by a teacher.
