

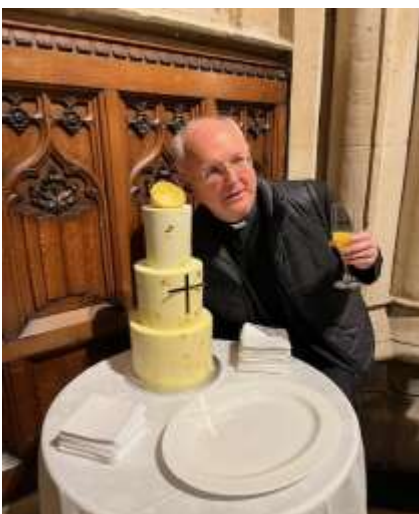
Dear Students, Parents, Carers and Governors

## Chaplaincy thoughts for the week...

### Christmas Dress Up Day & Lunch

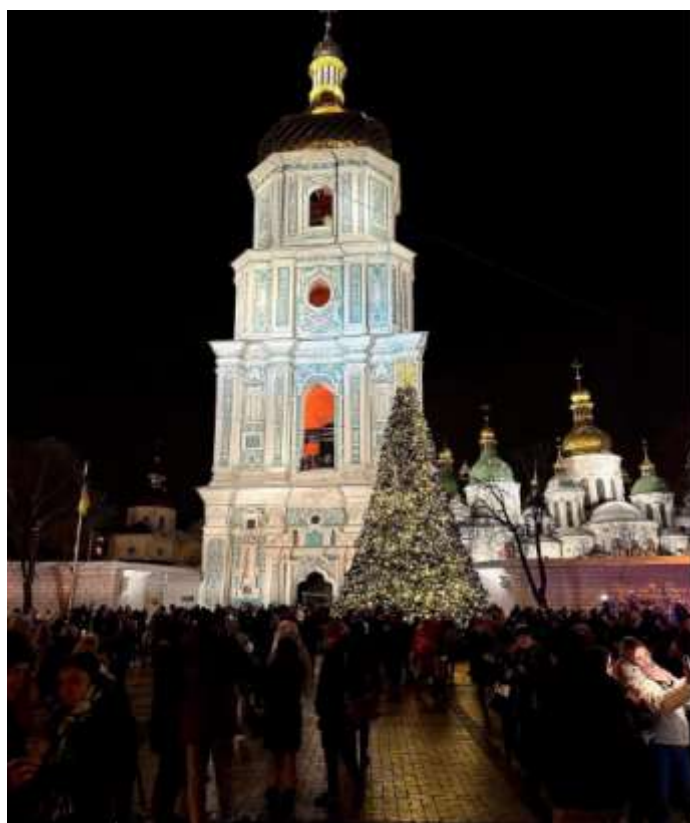
Thank you to everyone who supported our Christmas Dress Up Day this week; we raised over £500 for Save The Children. So many students made an extra effort to look festive, with plenty of lights, tinsel and messages of joy adorning costumes. There were also a lot of Grinch outfits - the character seems to have made a return to people's focus again. Sadly, no outfit has managed to outdo one from three years ago when a Year 8 student went above and beyond creating a costume that captured the entire nativity. I would share the picture, but that student is now in Year 11 and may not remember her enthusiasm as fondly anymore! It was great to see everyone sharing Christmas lunch together, with lots of singing along to Christmas classics and big participation in our lunchtime quiz.

### Advent Week 1 – Hope

The first candle on the Advent wreath is the candle of **hope** and there was a defiant sharing of this message earlier this week in Kyiv with the illuminating of the main Christmas Tree in the centre on the feast of St Nicholas. It is the first time that the ceremony has taken place on 6 December due to Ukraine changing their Christmas dates to fall in line with the Gregorian calendar, rather than Russian orthodox dates, whilst still in the midst of war. When president Zelensky signed a law earlier this year moving Christmas from 7 January to 25 December, he spoke of the *“relentless, successful struggle for their identity”* and *“the desire of all Ukrainians to live their lives with their own traditions, holidays,”*. Question marks had been raised as to whether the ceremony would be able to take place this year due to the continued ban on large gatherings - Kyiv recently being hit by more attacks. However, the power and symbolism of hope and light in Advent shone through, and although no food courts, markets or large celebrations took place, thousands of locals assembled in front of the Church of St Sophia to witness the tree light up for the first time.

## Year 9 Bovington Tank Museum Trips



On Monday 4 and Tuesday 5 December, the History Department took our Year 9 Students on an educational visit to Bovington Tank Museum in Dorset. The trip included three workshops run by the Tank Museum. One of the workshops was a journey to the trenches during WW1 which included a whistle-stop tour of a mock-up recruitment office, the train journey to France, life behind the trenches and a British and a German trench to allow the students to see what life would have been like for the soldiers from the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth.

The students were lucky enough to go inside a Mark IX tank from WW1 and were shown how it would have operated, which is not open to the general public. They were also able to see the only Mark I tank left in the world and they had a session on The Rise of Adolf Hitler filled with artefacts from the period, which was incredibly engaging and gave them some good knowledge for later in Year 9 and also the GCSE course.

The staff from the museum and our school staff were incredibly impressed with their behaviour and engagement on both days, especially considering the longer journeys each way due to bad weather! We are very proud of our Year 9 cohort for representing the school so well. Thank you to all the students and staff who supported the trip for a brilliant two days!

## Absences

### Reporting Absences

#### Feature on the Class Charts (parent) App

Please use the Class Charts app to notify the school if your child is going to be absent. The absence telephone line is still available, however we would prefer you to use this app if possible. This should not only be easier for you, but will allow the school to be more efficient when recording student absences. Once we have acknowledged the absence, you will receive a confirmation email to the account that is registered in the app.

If your school has decided to allow parents to report absences, you will see the **Absences** tab when viewing pupils from that school.

Selecting this tab will display a list of **absences that you have reported**, once you have reported them. This includes **when the absence took place**, the **reason for the absence** and who **acknowledged your absence report**.

To report an absence, click on the **Report new absence** button.

Next, enter the details of the reported absence into the **form** provided.

You can also include up to 5 **files** in your absence report as **supporting evidence**. To do this, click on the **Attach supporting evidence** button and select the files of your choice.

Click on the **Submit** button to send your pupil's absence report to their school. The absence can be **edited** and **deleted** until it has been **acknowledged** by a teacher.
