Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to term 4 of the school year. I hope you all had a lovely half term break, and you have now got back into a regular routine. This is a very busy and exciting term for us in the New Sixth, with many opportunities and challenges for our students.

Year 13 now have only eight full school weeks left of their studies. I would encourage these students to make the most of every lesson and opportunity right up until their last day. They will end their studies on Wednesday 8th May and this will be a half day of celebration in the Gateway building. More details will be released nearer the time. As mentioned Year 13 students will have the option in the remainder of this week to get additional support from teachers during their normal timetabled lessons with A Level examinations starting on Monday 13th May. All students in Year 13 will be sent their personalised exam timetable for the summer very soon.

There are a number of supported study and intervention sessions being put in place for Y13 to access. I will be sending out information on what opportunities are available next week. This will be useful to both Year 13 for their summer examinations and Year 12 who will have their mock examinations at the end of April.

At the end of last term, Year 12 students were made aware of some of the leadership opportunities that they can apply for. One of these opportunities was the application to the student leadership team. A letter detailing how to apply was sent out to all students and there was a large number of applications. Interviews were given to all applicants at the start of this term conducted by the Headteacher and myself and we were extremely impressed by quality of presentation from the sixth form students. Well done to everyone who applied and successful applicants will be informed next week.

There will be an upcoming event for all Year 12 Students who are interested in applying for Oxbridge. Students and parents will be invited to attend the BANES Oxbridge Conference on 14th March which is being hosted by Hayesfield. This event is part of our programme to support students in the application process for next year and the transition into the wider world.



Important Reminders for Sixth Form students

- The LRC is a **silent workspace** for students to work, revise, complete assessments etc. This applies at the end of the school day and during transition times.
- **No eating** is permitted at any time in the LRC.

Chrome Books:

The chrome books are an expensive resource and should be respected as such. When you take a chrome book from the trolley to use anywhere in the sixth form block (they are not to be removed from the Gateway Building) please return it to the trolley and plug in the cable so that the device is charging ready for the next person to use. You can tell if it is charging as the light will be red or green. No light means the cable has been plugged in the wrong side of the chrome book.

Lanyards:

It is mandatory for all 6th Form students to be **wearing** their lanyards at all times so they are visible. It is a breach of safeguarding and uniform policies when students do not wear them or carry them in bags/pockets.

Please remember that the LRC is a **quiet** work space for students to use during lesson times and before/after school for quiet study. **No food is permitted in the LRC**.

Students are more than welcome to socialise, eat and study in the café area in the Gateway building and there is often plenty of free space.

WIFI PROBLEMS

Here are some ideas to try....

- Click on the SGCC_BYOD access point
- You will be prompted to enter your username and password (this is your school login that you use to login to a school pc)
- Try logging on to a school pc to make sure your login is working first just in case your password is wrong or expired.
- If it asks you for a EAP method select **PEAP**.
- If it asks you to select a certificate select **Don't** Validate
- Select Connect or OK and it should connect to SGCC_BYOD
- You will notice you can't get on many websites as a Smoothwall block message appears so you need to install a security certificate.
- Browse on your device to <u>http://10.6.212.1/getmitm</u> and follow the instructions.
- The majority of the time you just need to click on the download certificate button and it will install itself, if not the instructions are there you help you.
- Make sure you don't have any VPN apps or proxy setting in your browsers as the firewall will detect them and stop the connection from working.

If all these fail and you still can't connect go to Mrs Kinch and ask to speak to IT Support and we'll be happy to help you.

16-19 Bursary Fund

In Sixth Form there is a **Bursary Fund** to help students to pay for Text Books, Stationary and IT, Compulsory Subject Trips,Transport, Uniform/clothing and course equipment.

The Bursary fund is limited and is discretionary and means-tested for eligibility, however this should not deter applicants from applying. Bursary's do **not** affect the calculation of any other benefits you may be receiving such as universal credit.

If you think you might qualify, and have to buy bus fares, clothing or books, or need help funding school trips, **retain your receipts**. If your application is approved by the School Governors these costs can be reimbursed.

School Gateway App

At St Gregory's we use the School Gateway, an essential tool to keep you informed about what is going on at school. It keeps everything in one place, behind one login, so you can easily keep in touch.

Please download this app to your phone (it's free) as it will help us improve communication with parents and carers.

The set-up process is simple and will take no more than a couple of minutes:

1. Search for "School Gateway" in the Apple App Store/ Google Play or on your phone and go to

www.schoolgateway.com/apple (Apple) or

www.schoolgateway.com/android (Android).

- 2. Install the app and if you are asked then say yes to "Allow Push Notifications".
- 3. When you launch School Gateway for the first time, please select 'New User' and enter the email address and mobile telephone number you have registered with the school.
- 4. The system will send a PIN code to your phone; please enter this PIN code and the app will be activated for you.

As soon as you have got the system set-up, all of the text messages we send you will appear in the app; you will receive notifications/alerts as normal.
