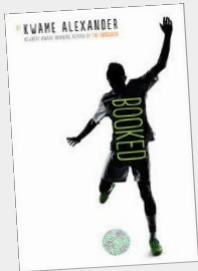

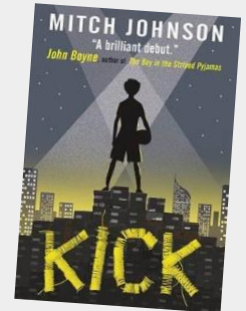


Booked by Kwame Alexander

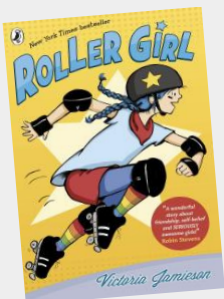


Do Goalkeepers wear tiaras? by Helena Pletichaty
